## **First Evening Prayer SOLEMNITY OF THE ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD**

## Introduction

We enter the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord, by remembering the evening of March 24, 1987, with the words of Mother M. Thecla Molino, the Superior General at that time: *«At the beginning of this liturgical feast, particularly significant for all the Sister Disciples, the Divine Master came to call Mother M. Scholastica Rivata* to the heavenly community. She was the first of the eight Sister Disciples set apart by the Founder to give life to our Religious Family. The entire Congregation owes her a great debt of gratitude. The affection with which we accompanied her in her long journey of suffering and silent consummation will continue to keep us in communion with her. We express this by invoking her intercession and finding in her the model of a mother and a sister who lived fully the charism drawn directly from the heart of the Founder. ...»

In thanksgiving to the Most Blessed Trinity for the gift of the life of Venerable Mother Scholastica, we entrust to her intercession our upcoming General Chapter and the Celebration of the Centennial of Foundation.

In 1976, while Mother Scholastica was still living, Mother M. Lucia Ricci said: "Whoever recommends themselves to the prayer of Mother M. Scholastica can be confident that they will obtain whatever is most pleasing to God, because she is a person very dear to God".

Today let us also receive the heartfelt invitation that Mother Scholastica made to the sisters, asking for prayers and offerings for peace at the time of the Second World War:

«In these difficult and troubled times, let us offer everything to the Lord out of love and trust in his infinite mercy... We trust in God that he may always keep us far from danger and that he may grant us peace soon!».
